What is ASI (Addiction Services Initiative)

- Intro in 2001 to assist Ontario Works participants whose addiction is a barrier to employment. The ASI is intended to be an employment program which helps clients to obtain appropriate addiction treatment in order to help move them toward employment
- Clients must be in the contemplation stage of change willing to work towards employment goals.







How to receive ASI

- There are two primary ways that a participant is screened into the ASI program:
 - Self-disclosure: participants who come forward on their own to say that they have a substance use problem which is a barrier to employment or participation in employment assistance activities.
 - Identification by caseworker: participants who exhibit behaviours which indicate they might have a substance use problem that impairs their ability to participate in employment assistance activities or to get and keep employment.







ASI Case Manager

- Provides intensive case management
- Coordinating services and ensuring that services provided are appropriate for their clients.
- Linking participants to necessary services and informal support systems;
- Frequent and/or semi-frequent contact (with a suggested service standard of a phone call or a visit at least once a month).
- Ongoing monitoring of participant progress and needs through more intensive use of Individual Service Plans; and
- Client advocacy, client supports and interceding where necessary to ensure access and fairness.







RELAUNCH OF ASI FOR DUFFERIN OW

- Relaunch in January 2019 with an anti-stigma lens
- Mirrored "People who Use Drugs are real People" campaign which originated in BC.
- Public Health is currently running similar campaigns in Toronto and Simcoe County
- Used a "real person" instead of stock phone for our campaign
- Message to recipients is that there is no shame in asking for help
- Message to staff is this can happen to anyone must not judge and be compassionate
